Each team must supply a dozen new baseballs at the start of the tournament. Each team will be guaranteed four games. Some local teams may play Friday June 24th if necessary. All games will be played at the Eastmont Parks 4-Plex at the intersection of Grant Rd and Georgia Ave. Concessions and shirts/sweatshirts will be available for purchase.

Eastmont Apple Capital Tournament Rules 11u and 12u Division 50/70

General Rules

- Cal Ripken rules apply unless otherwise noted.
- Special emphasis will be placed during live action for players and coaches to remain behind protective screens for safety purposes.
- On deck batters may use the on-deck circle behind the batter.
- A coin toss will determine the home team for each game for pool play, seeding will determine for bracket play.
- Infield fly rule will be in effect. (Runners on 1st, 2nd, less than 2 outs).
- Determination of an infield fly is by the umpire's discretion.
- Courtesy runners are allowed for the catcher only. Whoever made the last out will be the runner.
- Game Reports, signed by both managers, must be submitted after each game to Tournament Director or Concession Stand.

Equipment

- NO metal cleats allowed.
- Bats must have USA Baseball logo and be on "USA Bat" approved list
- A full use batting helmet, which covers the top and back of the head and the side of the face, must be worn when at bat, while on base, and until player has reentered the dugout.
- The catcher must wear all appropriate protective gear which includes: a protective helmet/mask that fully covers ears, chest protector, shin guards, protective cup, and throat guard. Coaches may warm up their pitchers without wearing a mask. However, they accept all liability for injury.

Pitching Rules

- Pitch count rules are being used. Home book keeps track of pitch count. Please confirm pitch counts between innings.
 - 1-40 Pitches, may pitch the next day
 - 41-65 Pitches, 1 day rest required
 - 66+ Pitches, 2 days rest required
 - 85 Pitch max in one day
- Limit of 5 warm up pitches between innings for returning pitchers. New pitchers get 8 warm up pitches.
- Any manager or coach who visits the mound more than once in an inning to talk to a player or players must make a pitching change.

Batting

- Teams may bat 9 or 10 players and use full substitution rules.
- Or teams may bat their entire roster, in the same order throughout the game, and
- freely use defensive substitutions.

- No slug bunting is allowed. Batter will be called out on any attempt.

Base Stealing and Sliding

- Lead off/Steal/Dropped third strike rules
- No head-first sliding will be allowed. You will be called out. Head-first sliding is allowed only when returning to a base. On close plays at 2nd, 3rd or home, runner must slide or will be called out. (Umpires decision).

Game Time Limits

- Pool games have a two-hour limit and no new innings will start after 1 hr 50 min.
- The home team is the official book keeper and will be responsible for documenting the start time.
- There is not a time limit in bracket play.
- No formal infield/outfield will be allowed prior to game.
- Every effort will be made to keep the games on schedule.
- Please use outfield grass and batting cages for additional warm ups.
- Games will be a maximum of six (6) innings unless the 10-run rule applies.
- If a team is ahead by ten (10) or more runs at the end of four (4) full innings of play, or ahead by twelve (12) at the end of (3), the game will be called and the team ahead will be declared the winner. End of half inning if home team is ahead.

- Overall Record
- Head-to-head
- Runs allowed

Tie Breaking Games

- Kansas City Tie Breaker
- Batter who made last out from previous inning goes to second base
- Team starts with one out
- More than one innings of KC Tie Breaker can be played up to the time limit if time allows
- If tied after the KC Tie Breaker, the game is a tie

Sportsmanship

- Tournament directors and umpires are in charge of the games and have the authority to ask anyone to leave who is being disruptive, abusive, or otherwise causing an unmanageable situation.
- Intimidating umpires or tournament officials in any way will not be tolerated.
- Fans are the responsibility of the individual teams.
- Coaches are to control their fans sportsmanship.
